PEAK ENERGY ALERT

July 29, 2025 — Freeborn Mower Electric Cooperative and People's Energy Cooperative are issuing a peak energy alert beginning this afternoon at approximately 2:00 p.m. The 'heat dome' affecting much of the United States is having a significant effect on the regional electric grid. Cooperative members are urged to reduce usage as they are able.

Members enrolled in energy management programs will be affected from approximately 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Members can conserve electricity during peak alerts by:

- Setting their cooling systems to at least 78°, higher if no one is home.
- Closing window coverings to help keep heat outside the building.
- Running the dishwasher or doing laundry later in the day.
- Using a microwave instead of the oven to cook.
- Refraining from turning on televisions or gaming systems.
- Postponing charging your electric vehicle.

Each seemingly small action can collectively make a big difference in the demand made on the electric grid.
