Planting Safety

It's easy to get caught up in the rush of spring planting, cleaning, and construction and forget about electrical safety.

This spring, remember:

- Tall or cumbersome equipment can easily come in contact with overhead power lines, creating an electrocution threat to everyone below.
- As a general rule of thumb, keep all objects at least 10 feet away from overhead power lines and call before you dig to avoid underground lines.
