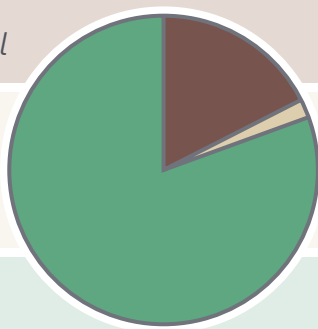
We employ 57 professionals who are committed to providing exceptional service and motivated to recognize risk and utilize safe work practices to protect themselves and others.

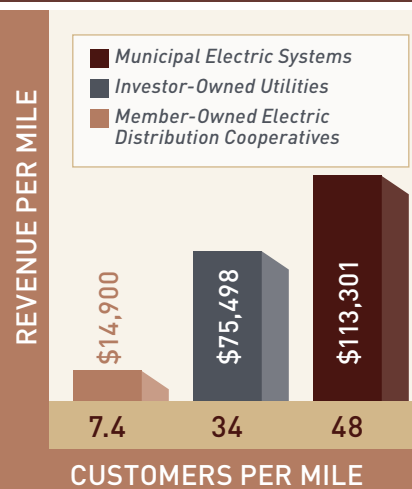
